Education Programs: Strengthen teaching and learning

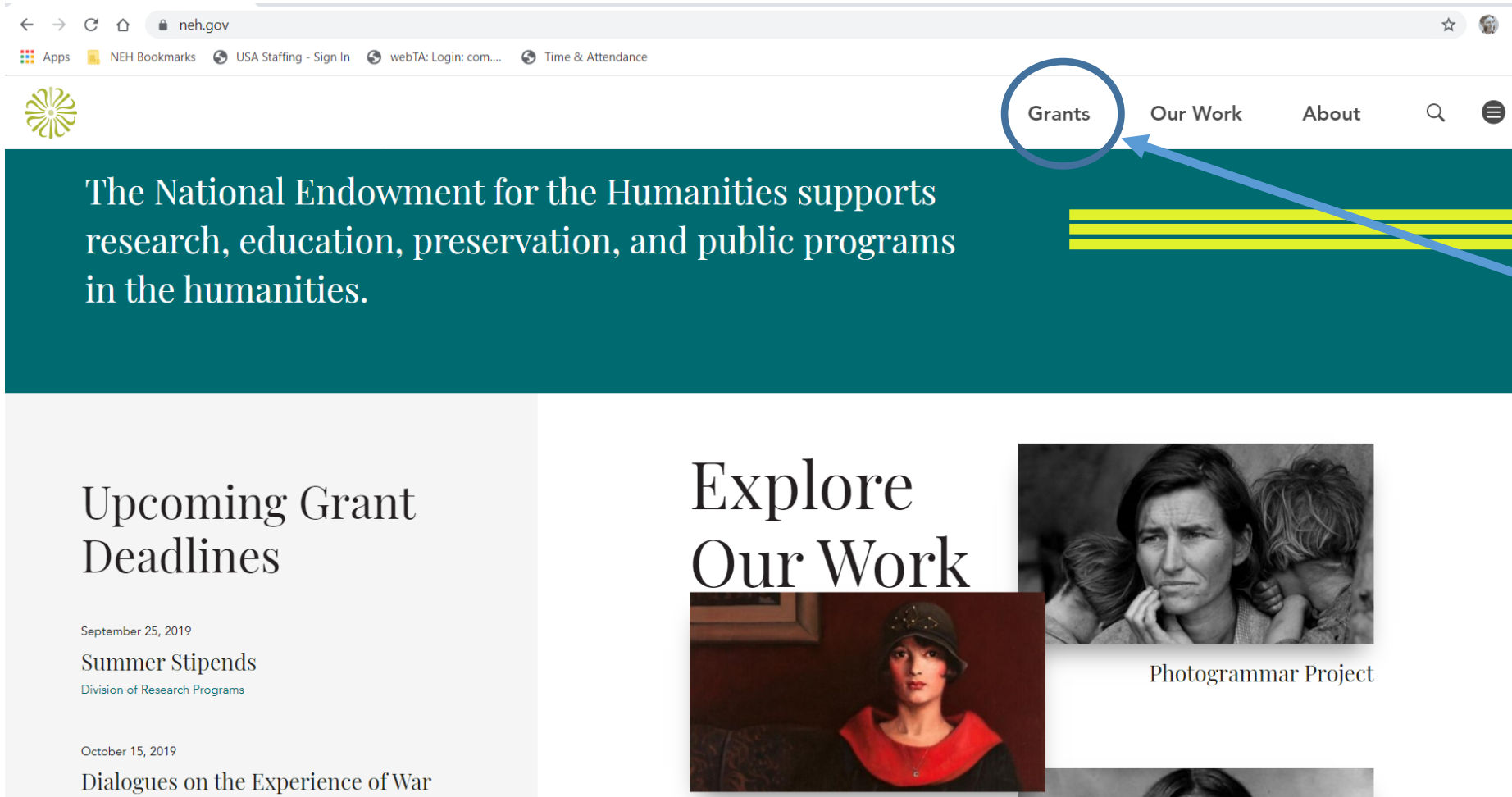
Federal/State Partnership: Support state and local humanities engagement

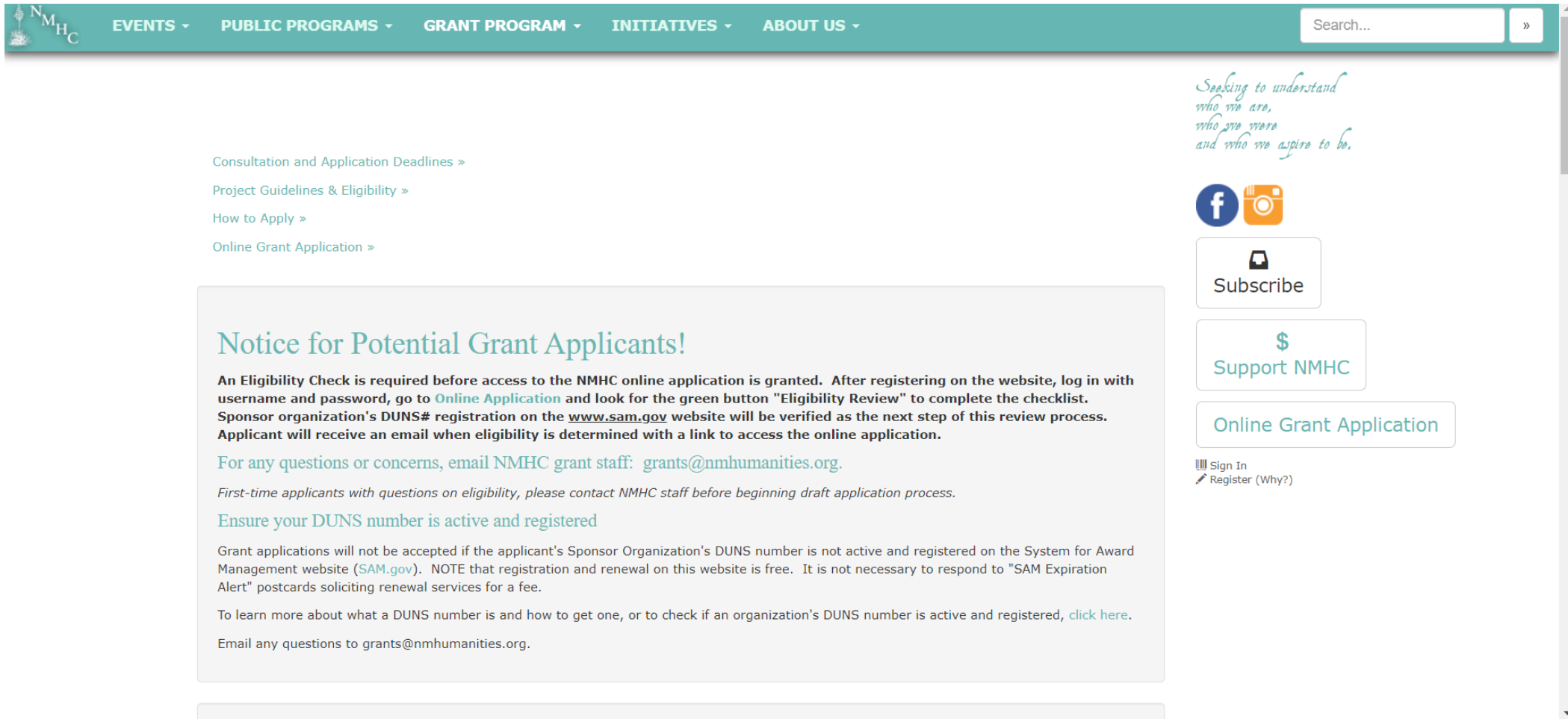

Notice for Potential Grant Applicants!

An Eligibility Check is required before access to the NMHC online application is granted. After registering on the website, log in with username and password, go to [Online Application](#) and look for the green button "Eligibility Review" to complete the checklist. Sponsor organization's DUNS# registration on the www.sam.gov website will be verified as the next step of this review process. Applicant will receive an email when eligibility is determined with a link to access the online application.

Ensure your DUNS number is active and registered

Grant applications will not be accepted if the applicant's Sponsor Organization's DUNS number is not active and registered on the System for Award Management website (SAM.gov). NOTE that registration and renewal on this website is free. It is not necessary to respond to "SAM Expiration Alert" postcards soliciting renewal services for a fee.
