What We Fund

McCune funds work in the state of **New Mexico**, across **9** priority areas. All grants are general operating grants.

Our Arts Priority area is called “**Bridging Links Between Arts and Community Engagement**” and it focuses on leveraging arts, creative expression and aesthetic experiences for the purposes of inspiring higher levels of community and civic engagement in New Mexico communities.

McCune grants range from 10k—100k for a 12 month period

- **Cultivate** (Building Alignment, Shared Vision): \$10k-\$25k
- **Focus** (Deepening Collaboration, Shared Work): \$25k-\$50k
- **Lead** (Integrating Function): \$50k-\$100k



How We Fund

McCune's open cycle occurs once annually, starting August 15 and closing in mid-September (check our website for deadline date each year)

Funding decisions are announced the following spring, in early March

All applications must be submitted online
